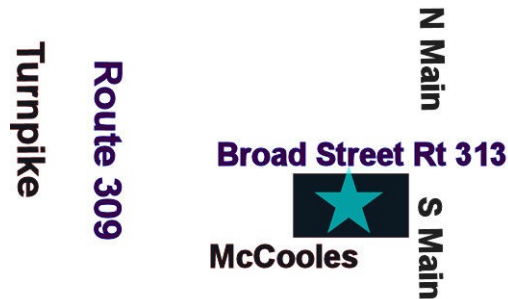

- ◆ **McCoolle's Red Lion Inn:** Used as a meeting place in 1799 for the organizers of Fries Rebellion, a rebellion by Germanic Pennsylvanians against a tax imposed to fund a war with France www.mccoollesredlioninn.com
- ◆ **Burgess Foulke House:** Built in 1812 and now houses the Quakertown Historical Society. It was moved from its original location along Route 309 in 1974. It was built by Edward Foulke, whose son became the first mayor (Burgess) of Quakertown.

- ◆ **Liberty Hall:** A small residence dating to 1772. September 1777 the Liberty Bell was moved from Philadelphia to protect it from the British.
- ◆ **Richland Library Company:** Established in 1789 is the seventh oldest library in Pennsylvania.
- ◆ **Upper Bucks Chamber of Commerce Visitors Center:** New home at 21 N Main Street. www.ubcc.org
